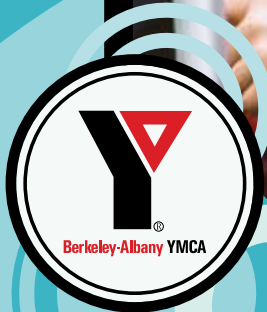
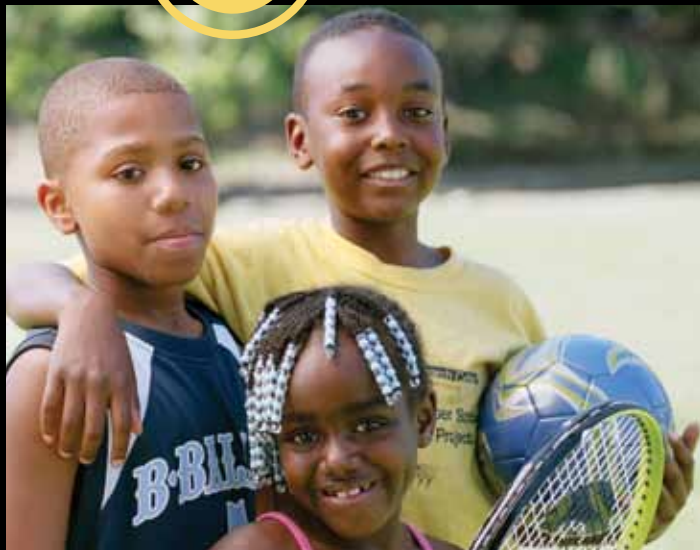


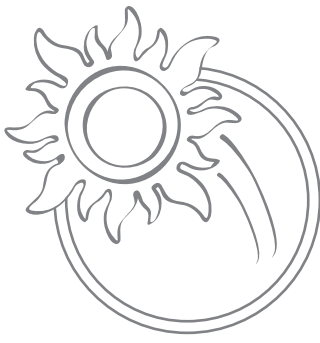

Welcome to Downtown Berkeley YMCA's Summer Camp 2010

Camp Philosophy

Our YMCA day camps encourage fun, self-discovery and group adventures while teaching important character values. Every camp we offer fosters an atmosphere that reflects our four character values: caring, honesty, respect and responsibility. Our camps are age-specific and ensure a meaningful and exciting experience for campers of all ages.

Staff

Your child's safety is our first priority. Our staff is certified in CPR and First Aid. Camp staff are also fingerprinted and required to attend mandatory camp trainings on safety, age-appropriate games and activities, character values, conflict resolution, and positive discipline.

In addition, the camp staff is trained in proper traveling procedures to ensure your child's safety on field trips.

Camp Registration

Camp registration begins **March 15** at the Welcome Desk at the Downtown Berkeley YMCA. Registration will continue until programs are full.

Welcome Desk hours:

Monday - Friday 6:00 AM - 9:00 PM

Saturday - Sunday 7:00 AM - 7:00 PM

How do I register?

1. If you're not already a member of the Downtown Berkeley YMCA, a \$35.00 Program Membership is required to participate in camp.
2. Once your child is a member, fill out and submit your camp registration form with your deposits or payment in person at the Welcome Desk. Be sure to pick up a Parent Handbook!
3. A \$25 deposit per camp week is required to secure a spot for each week your child will be attending. Deposits are **nonrefundable and nontransferable** between camp weeks or any other YMCA program.
4. Balances for each camp week are due two weeks prior to the camp session start date (see chart below). **An unpaid balance will result in a loss of deposit and loss of enrollment.** If you lose your spot, you may be able to re-enroll only if there is space. A new deposit will be required.

We accept cash, check, Master Card, Visa and ATM. Please save your receipt for payment verification. A service charge of \$25 will be applied on all returned checks.

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available to make YMCA summer camp accessible to everyone. Our financial assistance fund is made up of donations given to the YMCA by families and individuals in the community during our annual campaign. What funds we have available are based solely on money raised. Financial assistance is limited so **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE!** All applications must be completed and submitted at least one month prior to the week of camp you wish to attend. You will be notified regarding your application one week after applying. You must fill out an application even if you are currently receiving financial assistance from the YMCA. Unfortunately, we cannot accept financial aid applications from families who are receiving subsidized funds from other agencies.

Your financial assistance application does not guarantee your child a spot in camp. A separate deposit of \$25 is required for each week of camp to secure your child's spot. Once granted financial assistance, the discount is applicable to upcoming camp weeks. No refunds/pro-rates will be granted on past weeks of camp. There is a deadline that will be on your acceptance letter. You **MUST** put your deposits down before that deadline or your assistance award will be given to a different camper. Applications are available at the Welcome Desk and will be accepted starting in March.

Cancellations

Cancellations must be in writing. If received at least two weeks prior to the cancelled week, a refund for that week of camp minus \$25 is available in the form of a voucher to your YMCA account, or by check.

If cancellation is submitted less than two weeks prior to the week of camp, half of the full camp payment will be forfeited and not refunded. No refunds will be made once the camp week begins.

Cancellation forms are available at the Welcome Desk and at sign-in/sign-out.

Transfer Policy

Transfers to different camp weeks are granted on an availability basis only. Transfer requests must be in writing; forms are available at the Welcome Desk. Once the transfer request is submitted, the Director will contact you to let you know if space is available. Please be aware that the weekly deposit is not transferable and will not be applied towards the week of camp you wish to transfer into. A new deposit must be made to transfer.

Waiting List Policy

Once a week of camp is full, your child can be placed on the waiting list. Deposits are not required, but membership is. All registration forms must be complete to be put on the waiting list. You will be contacted only if space becomes available.

Want Your Child to Be With a Friend?

If you'd like your child to be in the same group as a friend, please write the friend's first and last name in the space provided on the camp registration form. Although we strive to satisfy all of our campers and families, we are not always able to accommodate friends or siblings being assigned to the same group.

Day Camp Sessions / Hours

Our day camps are one week sessions. Sign up for one week or all ten!

Hours: Monday - Friday 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM
(All campers should be at camp by 9:00 AM for opening!)
 AM Extended Care 7:30 AM - 9:00 AM
 PM Extended Care 4:00 PM - 6:00 PM

The YMCA will not grant refunds for camp days missed due to tardiness, illness or other reasons.

Extended Care

Extended care hours are offered at no additional cost. Children attending extended care simply sign in at the camp sign in table. Campers will engage in supervised free time activities until 9:00 AM at which time all campers will be escorted to camp opening. Your child may bring breakfast with them if needed.

Day Camp Schedules

Weekly camp schedules will be available two weeks prior to the start of each week. Occasionally times, locations, trips, etc. may be altered without notice. Please check with the information boards at sign-in for any changes/updates. Camp parent handbooks will be provided upon registration. Snack will be provided daily at 3:45 PM. Every Friday is "Freaky Friday". On Fridays we will have lots of different types of activities (relay races, carnival type games, etc) on site. We will provide lunch for the campers on Fridays.

Field Trip Transportation

Transportation for all field trips not within walking distance will be provided by chartered school buses, public buses or BART.

What to Bring to Day Camp

Label All Belongings

1. Lunch (sealable lunch box recommended), snacks, drink — except on Fridays!
2. Backpack with camper's belongings
3. Swimsuit (on designated swim days)
4. Athletic shoes should be worn each day
5. Water bottle
6. Sunscreen and/or hat



Campers Should Not Bring to Camp

1. Valuables: video games, walkmans/Discmans/iPods, money (exception: Middle School Adventures Camp on designated days)
2. Expensive clothing or jewelry

The YMCA staff is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Swimming

Swimming at the Downtown Berkeley YMCA pools is included in our day camps 1-2 days a week. A swim test will be given at the beginning of each week to ensure your child's safety. The camp schedule will indicate the designated days to bring a swimsuit. Light swim lessons will be taught by certified YMCA swim instructors for Kindergarten Transition Camp and Voyager campers. All other camps will have free swim.

Medications & Other Medical Needs

If your child has special medical needs, please complete a medication administration form and submit it to the camp staff at sign-in to ensure proper dosage and administration. All medication will be administered by camp staff.

Special Needs

If your child has any special needs, please inform the Director at the time of registration. If the YMCA cannot serve your child due to a lack of expertise or resources, we will try to recommend an alternate summer program. For the first time ever we are offering a one week "Special Camp". Look under specialty camps for details.

Emergency Procedures

Each camp carries a cell phone for emergencies. In the event of an emergency that requires medical attention, 911 will be contacted and the camper will be taken to the nearest medical facility. The parent or guardian will be notified immediately. In the event of a natural disaster, campers will continue to be in the care of the YMCA until arrangements are made to return children to their parents/guardians.

Camper Behavior

All camp staff are trained in positive discipline techniques based on our YMCA character values. In the event of a behavioral problem, written reports will be completed and conversations will be held with the parents to try to resolve the issue. The YMCA reserves the right to contact a parent/guardian at any time for immediate pick-up from camp if necessary. The YMCA may remove any camper from the program at the Director's discretion if problem behaviors continue. Families who have a child who experienced behavior problems in our camp in the past will be notified before camp to set up a meeting and contract.

Camp Sign-in/Sign-Out Policy

Sign-in

All campers must be signed in by a parent, guardian, or designated adult. Parent/guardians of children who do not appear on the roster, or who have a balance due, will be asked to resolve the registration issue before attending camp.

Sign-out

Campers must be signed out of camp each day by a parent, guardian, or designated adult. For your child's safety, campers will be released only to those adults appearing on the registration form under the "Child release authorization" section. Please be prepared to present a photo I.D. each day to ensure that we are releasing each camper to the authorized adult.

Middle School Adventures

Parents/guardians of middle school campers can mark the box on the registration form allowing their child to sign him/herself in and out of camp each day. Please be aware that the YMCA is only responsible for the campers once they sign in. The campers are responsible for themselves once signed out, and will be asked to leave the premises. Campers will not be allowed to sign themselves in/out without parental permission.

Late Pick-up

A late pickup fee of \$1.00 for each minute will be charged after 6:05 PM. If campers are consistently being picked up late the camper may be dropped from the program at the Director's discretion.

Summer Day Camps

All of our day camps and the LIT program will be held at a BUSD school close to the Downtown Berkeley YMCA for drop off, pick up, and "on site" days. Camps will often leave the site throughout the day on field trips and YMCA facility visits. Details about daily trips will be provided on weekly calendars that will be available two weeks before each camp week.

Kindergarten Transition Camp – entering grade K

The Kindergarten Transition Camp is a perfect way to help our camper's transition into their new school experience. Kindergarten teachers have helped develop a curriculum to assist your child in getting ready for school. We practice listening skills, conflict resolution, sharing and independence skills within our daily activities. Camp fun includes age-appropriate sports, nature projects, art, dance, gardening, swimming lessons and trips to the Kindergym. Campers explore the Berkeley area, and will visit local attractions such as the fire department, police station and library. We strive to create exciting activities while providing a safe and fun learning environment.

Voyager Day Camp – entering grades 1 - 2

Get ready for fresh summer fun! Our Voyager Day Camp is perfect for younger active campers. 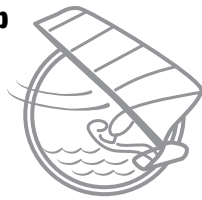

L.I.T. (Leader In Training) Program - entering grades 8 - 10

Cost: \$225 per session

Our leadership program is a great way to stay connected to camp, learn what it means to lead by example, and be a part of a community. This program is designed to give teens the opportunity to spend the summer with other teens, work with children, and have fun! During these 2-week sessions our young leaders will participate in "working with youth" trainings with our Leadership Director. Trainings will focus on communicating with children, appropriate camp behavior, conflict resolution, leading group activities, and safety. L.I.T.'s will assist our camp leaders with their small groups during camp and on field trips, plan camp projects, and spend time as a group on their own trips.

This program is only for individuals who truly want to participate. The program operates in 2-week sessions.



Resident Camps

Your Downtown Berkeley YMCA membership allows your child or teen to participate in different "Sleep Away" camps run by both the YMCA of the East Bay and the YMCA of San Francisco.

Specialty Camps



All of our specialty camps will use a BUSD school site for drop off and pick up. Each camp will leave the site often to embark on field trips, and utilize the YMCA. Camp hours are 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM with "free of charge" extended care hours available from 7:30 AM - 6:00 PM. Detailed calendars will be available 2 weeks prior to each camp session.

New Cooking Camp – entering grades 2 - 5

Week # 3 July 6 - 9

Cost: \$215 Code: 1COOK

Explore the world of cooking! We'll learn the proper techniques of preparing food, creating a meal, learning to read a recipe, as well as instilling the importance of eating healthy. The campers will be responsible to cook the meal and at the end of the week they will have a book full of the recipes that they helped make.

LEGO Engineering & Science Camp – entering grades 2 - 5

Back by popular demand LEGO camp in collaboration with Playwell.org is with us for a fourth summer. In this fun hands-on camp, our kids will explore concepts in physics, mechanical engineering, structural engineering, and architecture. Campers will get to create and learn about the components of structure design through the use of LEGOS and other engineering projects. This camp is great for those campers who love to build and create. When they are not working with LEGOS they will work on hands on science experiments.

New Yoga & Games Camp – entering grades 3 - 7

Week #6 July 26 – 30

Cost: \$300 Code: 1CYOGA

Children will work intensively with Laura Cornell from 9am-12 noon each day. (see instructor bio below). They will work on yoga and the connection between mind and body. They will engage in activities that will help them be more in touch with their bodies. They will also learn conflict resolution skills with Laura. After lunch they will play group games, create arts and crafts and visit local parks with YMCA camp leaders.

Laura Cornell, PhD, has over 20 years experience working with kids including teaching in public and private schools as well as a variety of summer camps. She holds a California Teaching Credential, and is certified in YogaEd (a Yoga program for children) and Kripalu Yoga. She coordinated a conflict resolution program at Rosa Parks School for seven years and trained parents, teachers, and social workers in peer mediation and social skills development with children. Art & Music Camp – entering grades 1 - 5

Crowden Music Center and MOCHA (Museum of Children's Art) team up in this creative two week camp!

Campers will spend half of each day making music, with singing, movement and performing with simple percussion instruments. The other half of the day, campers will paint, draw, build and sculpt a variety of puppets and play-things. This collaboration of the arts will conclude with campers performing a fabulous puppet show complete with musical score!

New Special Camp – entering grades K - 7

NEW Tennis Camp – entering grades 3 - 6

Whether you're a beginner, intermediate or advanced player, our instructors will help you play better tennis and get more enjoyment from the game. We focus on helping young players make dramatic improvements in their tennis game by enhancing fundamentals, ground strokes, focusing on strategy, and creating a supportive, competitive environment. Campers must bring their own tennis racket.

Skateboard Camp – entering grades 4 - 9
